How does Success Coaching work?


Success Coaching helps students transition to college, make the most of their student experience, and work through their own definition of success while at Mason.

Success Coaching Focus Area	Questions to ask:
Academics	What classes are you excited about this semester? Have you connected with your professors for those courses?
Career	Have you thought about looking into any internship or professional opportunities in your area of interest?
Civic Engagement	Have you considered signing up for a service learning or volunteering opportunity?
Commitment to Graduation	What is your motivation to graduating?
Effectiveness	How are you staying organized and managing your time?
Finances	Are you keeping track of how you are spending your money?
Managing Commitments	What are your commitments outside of class?
School Community	Are there any clubs or organizations that you are interested in joining?
Well-Being	Are you getting enough sleep? What is one thing you did for self-care this week?
