PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Leadership Mason Conference

1-day program focusing on leadership skill development through large group and small workshop formats. Students enhance the leadership skills they already have while gaining new skills that will be beneficial both now and in the future.

Includes education and programming focused on increasing understanding across difference. Opportunities will take place in a variety of formats including workshops, dialogues, 1:1 conversations, and debates.

Cultural Celebrations

Leadership Certificate Series

Virtual leadership cohort experience, designed to provide students with the opportunities to connect with others around various topics of leadership and develop a variety of different leadership skills and strengthen one's own personal leadership skills.

ACADEMIC AND COHORT EXPERIENCES

Active Leaders

10-week (2 hours each week), in-person seminar that will meet on Fridays during the Fall semester.

Program is designed to provide a more advanced leadership opportunity for any Mason student (undergraduate or graduate).

President's Leadership Seminar

An interactive and engaging experience that allows students to participate in a cohort leadership seminar with President Gregory Washington.

INTS 404: Leadership and Ethics

Students learn to better understand themselves as ethical leaders, develop ethical decision making strategies, communicate effectively in intercultural group settings, value civic engagement, and actively apply ethical leadership skills. This is a 4-credit course that takes place during the Spring semester.

UNIV 108: Black Male Success Initiative

The Black Male Success Initiative is a presidential level, university-wide investment, with an emphasis on the comprehensive success of Black men at Mason.

Study Abroad: Spain

"Leadership Across Difference: Lessons from Medieval Spain" is a 10 day, 3-credit study abroad program that examines collaboration and conflict among Muslims, Christians and Jews in Medieval Spain.

Experiential Abroad: South Africa

Experiential alternative break for students that provides a chance to foster one's understanding of global, social, and cultural issues.
