

How To Prepare for Virtual Advising:

First-Year Students

- Confirm all information looks accurate on PatriotWeb and that you can log-in
- 2. Know your AP/IB/CLEP scores, and any dual-enrollment credits and make sure they have been sent to the Office of Admissions
- 3. Take a look at recommended 4year plans for both our <u>BS</u> and <u>BA</u> programs
- 4. Check the catalog for <u>Mason Core</u> fulfilling courses



How To Prepare for Virtual Advising:

Transfer Students

- Review your transfer credit evaluation for any missing credits.
- 2. Ensure your FINAL transcript is submitted to the Office of Admissions.
- 3. Review your degree audit to see how your transfer credits are applying to requirements.



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
