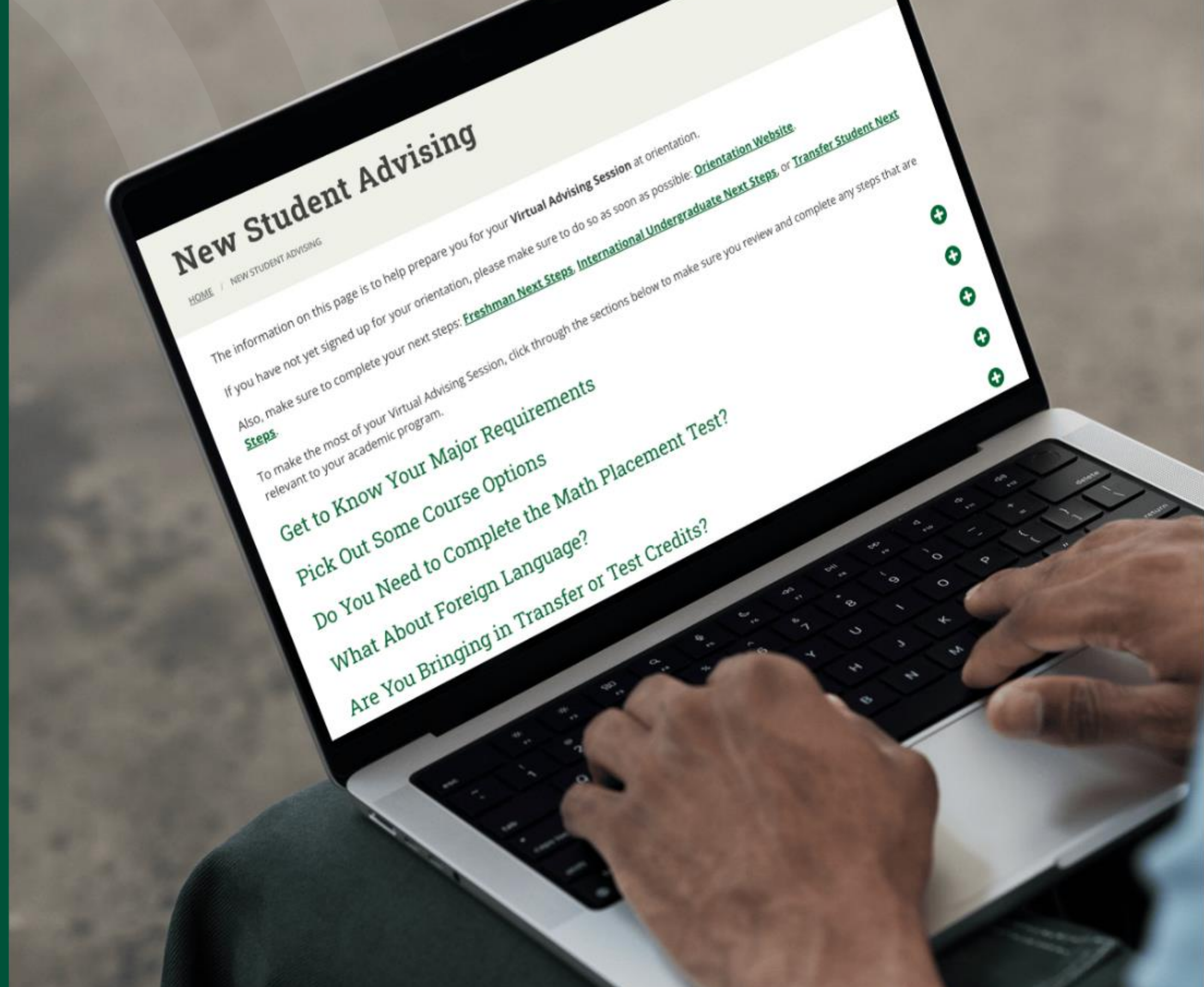

First-Year Students

Reach out to your advisor to introduce yourself

Review sample 4-year plans for your major

Prepare a list of college-level credits earned and make sure any test scores have been sent to the Office of Admissions

Log into Patriot Web to draft your schedule and resolve any "Action Items Pending"

Write down questions you want to ask during virtual advising

Reminders:

Know your **G number**

You won't be able to register for classes until the **day of** your virtual orientation session





Reminders:

Know your **G number**

You will register for classes during your **virtual orientation** session or **pre-orientation** advising session

Transfer Students



Reach out to your advisor to introduce yourself



Review your Transfer Credit Evaluation for any missing credits



Ensure your final transcript is submitted to the Office of Admissions



Review your degree audit to see how your transfer credits are applying to requirements



Log into Patriot Web to draft your schedule and resolve any “Action Items Pending”



Write down questions you want to ask during virtual advising
