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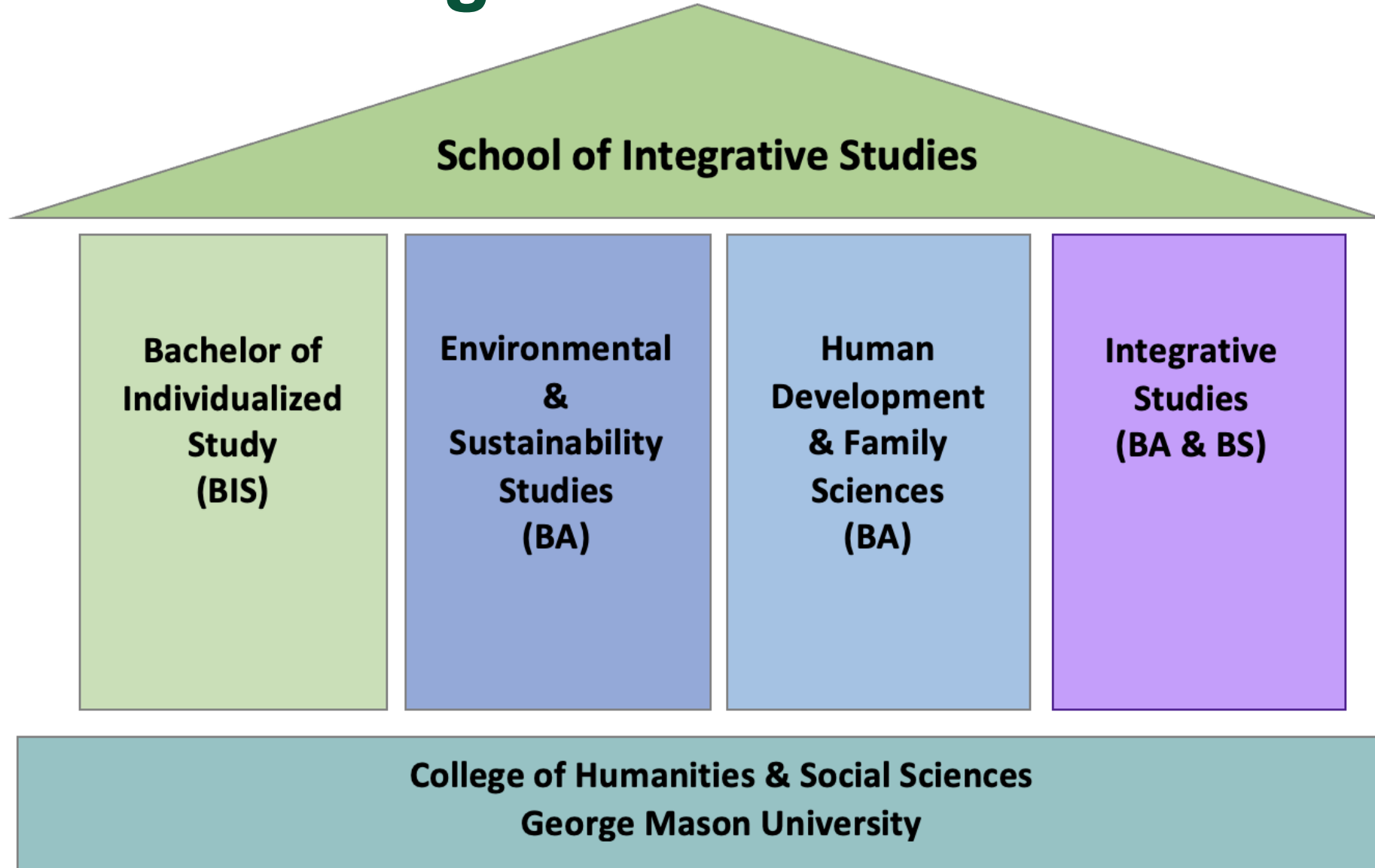

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA)

- The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords students certain rights with respect to their education records.
- When a student turns 18, or attends a postsecondary institution, FERPA rights belong to the student, not the parent.
- Mason does not release non-directory information unless a student has provided consent, the release is to the parent of a dependent student.

Tips for Success

1. Check your Mason email & log into Canvas daily.
2. Organize your personal and academic schedule; Establish a time management routine.
3. Review and understand each course syllabus.
4. Consult with an academic advisor every semester.
